XXXIX. OKLAHOMA OIL RESOURCES C. W. Shannon

From the Oklahoma Geological Survey,

The discussion of Oklahoma's oil resources gave a historical account of the oil and gas development in Oklahoma, the number of producing wells at the present time, and statistics on production from 1904 to 1922. Estimates were made as to the amount of oil which might be expected in future production in Oklahoma. The estimates as made by the Oklahoma Geological Survey were compared with those recently made by the U. S. Geological Survey and the result of both estimates is that there are sufficient oil reserves in Oklahoma to make Oklahoma an important oil producing state for at least twenty years to come.
