## XX. NOTES ON COLEOPTERA FROM SOUTHEASTERN OKLAHOMA WITH A FEW RECORDS FROM ADJACENT PORTIONS OF TEXAS AND ARKAN8A8, INCLUDING A NEW SPECIES.*

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From June 15 to July 12, 1925, the senior author was in charge of a collecting expedition in southeastern Oklahoma sent out by the University of Oklahoma Museum of Zoology. Since the main interest of the expedition was in the vertebrates, comparatively feiv Coleoptera were secured, and these chiefly by the senior author and G. S. Caughron. The scarcity of published records from the region, however, makes the publication of the present notes worth while.

The localities and dates represented by the present collection are: Wister, Le Flore Co., Okla. (June 15-16); DeQueen, Sevier Co., and Mena, Polk Co., Ark. (June 17) ; Broken Bow, McCurtain Co., Okla. (June 18-29, July6-8) ; a region one mile west of the Oklahoma-Arkansas line on the Red River, McCurtain Co., Okla. (July 1-2), and on the Texas side Bowic Co., (July 1); Grant and Sawyer, Choctaw Co., Okla. (July 12); Tuskahoma, Pushmatahz Co., Okla. (July 12).

In the list the numbers before the species are those used in C. W. Leng's "Catalogue of the Coleoptera of America North of exico" (1920). The species name is followed by a number inSating the number of specimens involved, and this is followed by Te date, locality record by county, and habitat. Unless otherwise sted, the county cited is in Oklahoma. Previous Oklahoma records are likewise noted.

The determinations and the single new species are to be credited to the junior author. The specimens are deposited in the University of Oklahoma Museum of Zoology and the collection of the junior author.

Description of POLYPHYLLA OKLAXIOMENSIS sp. n. Hatch.
Female: length 26 min. clypeus bisinuate; protibia tridentate; body above not scaly but with very sparsely distributed white hairs, ranging in length from about six times their width on elytra to about four times their width on meson of pronoturs; hairs quite
definitely aggregated into a vitta along meson of pronotum and along posterior half of suture on a narrow area increasing in widt. towards apex; hairs somewhat less definitely aggregated into a short subhumeral vitta and very feebly aggregated to form about three vittae on elytral disc; vertex of head and apical margin of pronotum with scattered hairs; apical sixth or seventh of elytra conspicuously paler.

The hairs are less scale-like and more scattered than in th: other known species. In the absence of a male, it is impossible to determine the affinities of this species, but these probably lie with squamicauda and verecunda of Casey.
