XXV. ODONATA COLLECTED IN SOUTHEASTERN OKLAHOMA DURING THE SUMMER OF 1925.*

Between June 8 and July 16, 1925, collections of Odonata were made by the Museum of Zoology expedition in southeastern Oklahoma. The collection is small and not at all representative of the area covered, as little time could be spent on this particular group. However, it is believed that data concerning specimens taken are of sufficient importance to be worth recording. One of the twenty-one species found is of particular interest. This is Celithemis fasciata Kirby, which was taken late in the afternoon, flying overthe Kiamichi River in Choctaw County. Dythemis velox Hagen is another form worthy of special mention as it seems to be true velox rather than any one of the four subspecies described.

The writer is greatly indebted to Mr. E. B. Williamson and to Mr. J. H. Williamson of Bluffton, Indiana, for the identification of the specimens. Except for some duplicates these specimens are all in the University of Oklahoma Museum of Zoology.

The nine localities from which specimens were secured are:

- (1) Six miles south of Wister, Le Flore Co.; Poteau River.
- (2) Fifteen miles south of Wister, Le Flore Co.; small tributary of the Poteau River.
- (3) Two miles north of Broken Bow, McCurtain Co.; Yanubbe Creek, a small stream with rocky bed which widens into pools at intervals.
- (4) Four miles northwest of Broken Bow, McCurtain Co.; Lukfata Creek, a somewhat larger stream than Yanubbe Creek.
- (5) Seven miles south of Broken Bow, McCurtain Co.; an old river "cut off" called "Pine Lake"; banks rather steep, water muddy and apparently stagnant.
- (6) Ten miles southeast of Broken Bow, McCurtain Co.; Mountain Fork River, one of the large relatively clear streams of this section of the state.
- (7) One mile west of the Arkansas-Oklahoma line, on the Red River, McCurtain Co.; old "cut offs" of the Red River, several hundred yards back from the present river bed.
- (8) One half mile west of Sawyer, Choctaw Co.; Kiamichi River.

(9) Four miles east of Tuskahoma, Pushmataha Co.; Kiamichi River, banks low and muddy.
