## XXII. SAY'S CHIPMUNK,—EUTAMIAS QUADRIVIT-TATUS QUADRIVITTATUS IN CIMARRON COUNTY R. C. Tate and L. B. Nice

A specimen of this small chipmunk was taken on August 27, 1926, by L. B. Nice high up in a canyon on the W. O. Cochran ranch which is located about five miles east of Kenton, Cimarron County, Oklahoma. The skin was prepared by R. C. Tate of Kenton and forwarded to the United States Biological Survey at Washington, D. C., where it was identified by Arthur H. Howell, Biologist, as Eutamias quadrivittatus quadrivitatus.

The specimen has considerable interest as it is the first authentic record for the existence of this chipmunk in the State of Oklahoma.
