XXV. FISH OF THE PONDS AND STREAMS OF OK-MULGEE COUNTY Edith R. Force

These specimens were collected under the direction of the writer from the ponds and streams of Okmulgee County, Oklahoma, during the early summer of 1926

They have been identified by the United States National Museum, Washington, D. C., and representative specimens deposited in this Museum. The names have been supplied by Mr. Carl L. Hubbs, University of Michigan. Duplicate specimens have been retained by the High School Museum of Okmulgee, Oklahoma, and others presented to the University of Oklahoma Museum of Zoology, Norman, Oklahoma, and to the University of Michigan Museum of Zoology, Ann Arbor, Michigan. There were collected, in all, about 800 specimens representing the following species and subspecies:
