AMPHIBIA FOUND IN A SURVEY OF TULSA COUNTY AND VICINITY

During the spring, summer, and fall of 1935, a considerable amount of collecting was done in the Tulsa region. Dates of the occurrence of the specimens taken were recorded and notes on natural history were made. The work on the Amphibia of northeastern Oklahoma is being continued and more complete accounts will appear later.
