



A NEW SPECIMEN OF SYMBOS FROM CHICKASHA,
OKLAHOMA

(Abstract)

In 1928 a new fossil specimen of *Symbos* (M.P.U.O. No. 646) was placed in the Museum of Paleontology at the University of Oklahoma. It consists of a fragment comprising the dorsal part of the brain case and a part of the left horn core. The specimen was taken from a pleistocene gravel pit at Chickasha, Oklahoma and is of considerable importance because it extends the possible range of the animal essentially one degree south and three degrees west.
