Arthur L. Charlton
(1890-1954)

Arthur L. Charlton passed away at his home in Talhequah, Oklahoma, on June 15, 1954, of a heart attack. He had been in poor health for some time and had not been able to meet his classes after the Christmas holidays.

Mr. Charlton came to Enid, Oklahoma, as a child with his parents from Chatfield, Ohio. After attending the public schools of Enid he entered Phillips University from which he received both the bachelor and master degrees. Later, he did graduate work at the Universities of Kansas and Colorado.

Mr. Charlton was principal of high schools at Temple and at Pawnee before coming to Northeastern State College in 1919, as head of the chemistry department, where he continued to teach until the time of his death.

He was an active member of the Methodist church and taught the young peoples' Sunday school class for several years. He also belonged to the Masonic lodge and was a member of several educational and professional groups including the Oklahoma Educational Association and the National Educational Association.

Surviving him are his widow, Hazel; a daughter, Mrs. Robert Blevins, Wichita, Kansas; two sons, Marine Lt. Arthur L. Charlton, Jr., San Diego, California, and James Horace Charlton, Wichita; a brother, John I. Charlton, Tulsa, and a sister, Mrs. Robert Stebbins, Enid.
