Eleven Years of Christmas Bird Counts in Northeastern Oklahoma, 1954-1964

This article continues the analysis of Christmas Bird counts in north-eastern Oklahoma, 1930-1953 (Kassing, 1954).

The present counts were recorded from six areas: Fort Gibson, Muskogee County; Spavinaw, Mayes County; Tulsa, Tulsa County; Cleora near Afton, Ottawa County; Bartlesville, Washington County and Hulah Reservoir, Osage County.

Comments concerning these counts would be much the same as those of 1954 since the same procedure was followed.

There have been from one to six areas in which separate counts were taken in northeastern Oklahoma in each of the 11 years. When records from the individual areas were examined, it was noted that 10 species were recorded on all areas in all years. These 10 species were: Flicker, Red-bellied Woodpecker, Hairy Woodpecker, Blue Jay, Crow, Carolina Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, Eastern Bluebird, House Sparrow and Slate-colored Junco. Of the 141 species, 40 were recorded on one or more areas each year.

There appear to be no especially rare birds in this account.

Table I summarizes the species observed and the number recorded.

An increasing number of observers have participated in the counts each year since 1954. There never were any groups with no experienced observers. Some of the author's early Junior High School members, from Woodrow Wilson Junior High School, Tulsa (1926-1956) have kept their interest, even becoming officers and leaders in the local and state Audubon Societies.
