THE PROGRAM IN PERSONNEL WORK AT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

THE GENERAL OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAM

The general objectives of the program are:

- To train students who are working for degrees in personnel work in the technical procedures, skills, knowledges, and arts of personnel work;
- (2) To develop a program in personnel work at the University of Oklahoma which will be acknowledged locally and nationally as the standard for professional training in the field of personnel work;
- (3) To organize and coordinate those facilities and resources of the University and the State which are pertinent to, and essential for, the development of professional training in personnel work;
- (4) To foster research which will contribute to the body of scientific and professional knowledge in the field of personnel work.

THE EXISTING NEED FOR THE PROGRAM

The program is designed to equip individuals to meet the requirements in three areas of personnel work. They are industrial personnel work, educational personnel work, and public personnel work. The requirements for the degrees were drawn up after a careful consideration of information obtained from the following five sources:

- (3) The educational requirements for various positions in the personnel field as observed and set forth in various publications;
