QUEER DOUBLE EGGS

The author has recently had brought to his attention the following queer types of double eggs:

An Indiana hen laid a double egg consisting of two normal sized eggs each with a yolk, but having a spindle about 3-8 inch in diameter and three inches long connecting the two eggs. The shell was continuous about the two eggs and the spindle connections.

A Goltry, Oklahoma hen laid a double egg consisting of a small yolkless egg perfectly shelled, surrounded with the white and shell of a second egg.

A Joplin, Missouri hen laide an egg like the last mentioned above, except that the inner egg had a yolk.
