

The 2011 Brenner Awards

The Don Brenner Outstanding Paper Award is an annual award, offered for the second time in 2011. To be eligible for the award, the lead author must present the paper at the annual meeting of the International Society for the Scientific Study of Subjectivity and submit a full paper at the same time. Publication in *Operant Subjectivity* is encouraged. Following the meeting in Birmingham, England in September, the ISSSS executive board appointed a committee to review nineteen submissions. The awardees will be formally recognized at the 2012 ISSSS meeting in Pittsburgh, USA, with the presentation of a certificate and a monetary prize.

Papers by Marshall A. Baker and Tim Deignan were judged first-equal by the award committee. Accordingly, it is with great pleasure that we publish them, in alphabetical order, in this issue. Marshall Baker studies in the Department of Agricultural Education, College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources at Oklahoma State University, and is supervised by Diane Montgomery. Tim Deignan is an independent consultant and contract researcher who worked as a lecturer and manager in the post-compulsory education and training sector before going freelance in 2000. He has worked for a range of clients including universities, general and specialist colleges, trusts, and non-governmental organisations, contributing to various projects from local to international level.
