

## FOREWORD

Susan Scheutzow's "Policy Makers of Tomorrow" compares the operant factor structures of three adolescents, two of whom aspire to political careers and the other who does not. The results reveal the importance of interpersonal relationships in the development of images and self schemata which provide a foundation block in the development of political motivation. Scheutzow's interest in this topic stems from her own political aspirations which take current form in her position as Executive Director of Planned Parenthood Affiliates of Ohio, prior to which she was administrative assistant to an Ohio state senator. She has served as coordinator for a statewide women's political training organization, and is currently a member of the Franklin County Democratic Executive Committee. In her copious free time she is completing her degree at the Capital University Law School (Columbus, Ohio) where she is an editor of the *Capital University Law Review*, in which she recently published a paper on parents' liability for their children's torts.
